
News

JCU students and Italian high school students collaborated to facilitate the Kick-off event and produce this document that highlights their experience. Participating students earned PCTO credit hours for their work/learning experience.

<u>Italy Reads</u> announces the **Professional Development Course for High School Teachers** in preparation for **Italy Reads 2020-2021**. Spaces are limited. This course is offered free of charge.

We'll be reading Rachel Carson's Silent Spring. Rachel Carson, American biologist and author is recognized as the founder environmentalism. Her book Silent Spring was published in 1962 and is considered a milestone in the history of ecological awareness. With Silent Spring she awakened public consciousness and established the global environmentalist tradition.



The emphasis of this course is to prepare teachers to engage their students in the study of this work from literary and interdisciplinary perspectives. Interaction among teachers and an exchange of best practices are encouraged.

Who? Applicants must teach English Literature and Culture in a *liceo*/high school, register as official participants in Italy Reads and include the program in their 2020-2021 curriculum.

When? Tuesdays, 21 Jan. - 5 May 2020, 4:30-6:30pm

Italy Reads 10th **Anniversary Project** – guidelines and updates on this ongoing project are forthcoming. Special **Italy Reads Teams** (JCU and high school students) will give students the opportunity to collaborate virtually and/or in-person on specific month-long projects.
